# A WALK DOWN THE STREET - BNPL EDITION

A rising trend within the markets right now includes the “Buy Now, Pay Later” sector. BNPL had been expanding rapidly even before the COVID pandemic, but due to the online shopping boom that occurred, it started growing at an even more rapid pace. Buy Now, Pay Later is a payment option that allows customers to pay for an item in multiple installments over time rather than all at once. Along with benefiting customers, retailers are also an advocate for this new payment method. Large retailers like Macy’s, Amazon, and Gap have all made deals with BNPL service providers, allowing their customers to now pay in installments for their purchases. A big reason BNPL benefits both the consumer and retailer is that it acts as an alternative for a credit card. Younger customers who don’t have a credit card can utilize BNPL to spread out their spending and even purchase items without having the cash on hand. Afterpay, a BNPL service provider, said that it expects the company’s U.S. merchants to see an \$8.2 billion increase in sales this year while Affirm Holdings said purchases made with its payment plans were on average 85% larger last year. Therefore, the payment method allows for customers to feel comfortable with spending more and retailers to have higher sales as well as gaining attraction from younger shoppers. A few key players which will be intriguing to follow moving forward are Affirm, Afterpay, and Klarna. Historically, the BNPL industry has been dominated by start-ups but traditional financial services companies such as Mastercard are also now entering the space. With Mastercard being well known amongst consumers and being trusted by banks, it will be interesting moving forward to see if the start-up companies will be able to keep their first-mover advantage or if the traditional financial services companies will begin to dominate the space. Currently, BNPL only accounts for about 2% of online sales in the United States but is expected to triple to close to 5% by 2024. However, internationally, BNPL has made great strides in that it accounts for 23% of online transactions in Sweden and close to 20% in Germany. Due to the BNPL industry’s relationship with particularly the younger generations, the industry will continue to grow and be available in all major retailers as BNPL companies have already begun to partner with big names.

## **Grand Soir**-*MFK.*



# BUCKET LIST FOR THE TRAVELER: EDINBURGH OF THE SEVEN SEAS, TRISTAN DA CUNHA



Looking to get away from it all? Well, I have the escape of a lifetime for you, “far from the madding crowd!” Like a green iceberg lost adrift in the turbulent sea, flung thousands of miles away from any other landmasses, lies the *most remote inhabited island* archipelago in the world: Tristan da Cunha. It’s about as far as you can get off the beaten path!



*Tristan da Cunha sits almost smack-dab in the center of the remote waters of the South Atlantic Ocean, over a thousand miles from even its closest neighbor, St. Helena!*

Tristan da Cunha is a British overseas territory consisting of six small islands: Tristan da Cunha, Inaccessible, Nightingale, Middle, Stoltenhoff, and Gough.

Of the six, Tristan da Cunha Island, referred to simply as *Tristan* by the nearly 250 residents who live on the archipelago, is the only inhabited island. (The only exception is the team of less than 10--meteorologists, medics, engineers, biologists--employed year-round by the South African Weather Service at the Gough Island Weather Station.)

All residents on the island live in a small settlement, Edinburgh of the Seven Seas, and are descendants of the original nine male founders on the island.

The nine surnames--Collins, Glass, Green, Hagan, Lavarello, Repetto, Rogers, Squibb, and Swain--are preserved and are held dearly by the island's eighty families. Ethnically ambiguous, they are of diverse ancestry, including Scottish, Dutch, Italian, and American, and speak a Tristanian-English patois, a dialect influenced by Afrikaans, Italian, and American tongues. They live without locks on their doors and with windows open, and their children are allowed to play freely without fear of harm. They help each other communally and everyone shares resources.

There is no air service to the island, so it is accessible only to those who are able to afford thousands of dollars to sail there on a mailship or research vessel. They must also be able to spend a month on Tristan before the ship makes its return voyage from either continent. Since there are no hotels or motels, visitors must lodge with one of the families, providing them with an excellent opportunity to become acquainted with the local people and immerse themselves in Tristanian culture.


In addition to those with a taste for unusual and extraordinary vacations, the island beckons many other specialists.

Lobster-lovers delight on Tristan. The crustacean is a main staple of the local diet and the island's chief export, carefully and sustainably harvested. Anyone who enjoys eating lobster will be happy at mealtime on the island. Potatoes often accompany every meal--boiled, baked, mashed, stuffed, fried, you name it!-- as every family owns several fields in the Potato Patches to grow their primary and vital potato crop.



Volcanologists rejoice as they climb to the nearly 7,000-foot-high Queen Mary's Peak, the top of the massive shield volcano that forms the island. It is an active volcano, having last erupted in 1961, almost destroying the village and forcing the inhabitants to evacuate for a short period of time.

Those who wish to explore or just commune with nature without accidentally stepping on a loathsome reptile will be happy here, as there are no snakes on Tristan. (St. Patrick must have sent one of his deputies.)

Lovers of marine and avian wildlife will have an unparalleled experience observing native and unique species. Schools of exotic fish—Tristan five-finger, Tristan wrasse, and False Jacopever—are abundant, weaving among the 150-foot-tall giant kelp forest high-rises they call home. The giant kelp cities are constantly growing too, at an accelerated rate of over a foot a day! Subantarctic fur seals, and many varieties of whales and dolphins also find themselves indulging lavishly in the rich Tristan waters.

There are three native albatross species that nest exclusively on the Tristan da Cunha Islands: Atlantic yellow-nosed albatross, sooty albatross, and Tristan wandering albatross. Hundreds of thousands of Great Shearwaters also breed exclusively on the islands. Tristan is home to a sprawling community (up to 75% of the world's population) of Northern Rockhopper penguins

known on the island as pinnamins. Although one of the smallest penguin species, they are some of the most agile, and can be seen swiftly catching a bite to eat in the teeming waters off the coast of the island.

Luckily, not a single COVID-19 case was reported on the island and the British Ministry of Defense went to great lengths to deliver and administer Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccinations to all of the residents. With the pandemic waning, travel to this most remote of destinations seems possible in the very near future, after which you can boast to your other well-traveled friends that you have gone to a place they have never even heard of before.




